Hardware and software environment requirements for Android version of the phone

- Mobile phone memory of 1G or more.
- Android 4.1 and above operating system.

Hardware and software environment requirements for Apple version of the phone

- Require iphone 6s and above.
- 1G+ memory on board.
- ios 13 and above operating system.

3.1 Registration

Operation steps

Step1 Click on "Sign Up", and then go to the registration page.

Step2 Fill in the user name, password and confirmation password as required and fill in the email address (optional). We recommend entering your email address to receive the verification code when resetting your password.

Step3 Click on "Terms of Service" to view and tick the Terms of Service.

Step4 Click "Next" to enter into product introduction.

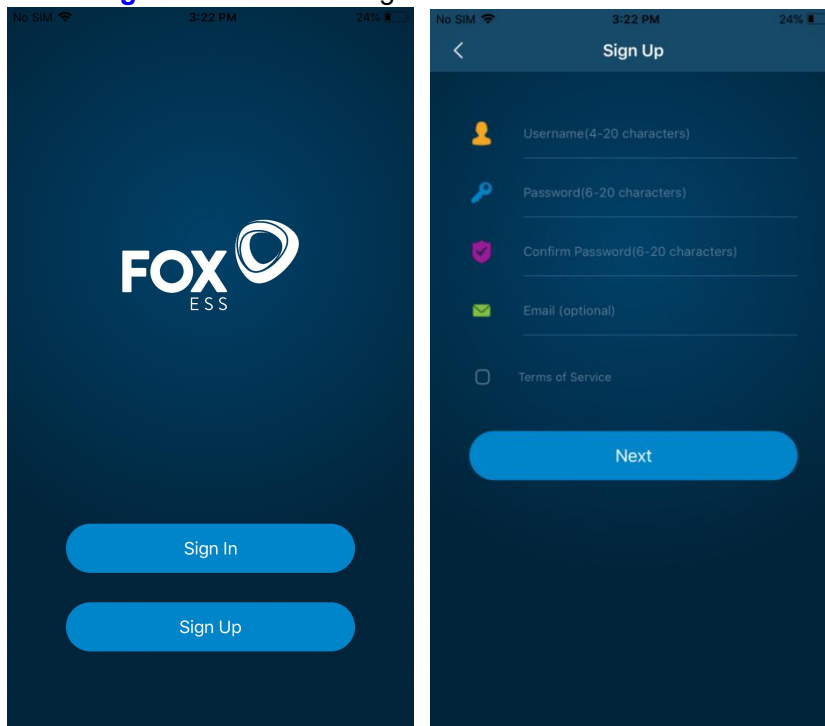
Step5 The product introduction screen has three roles to choose from, the roles are end user, installer and agency.

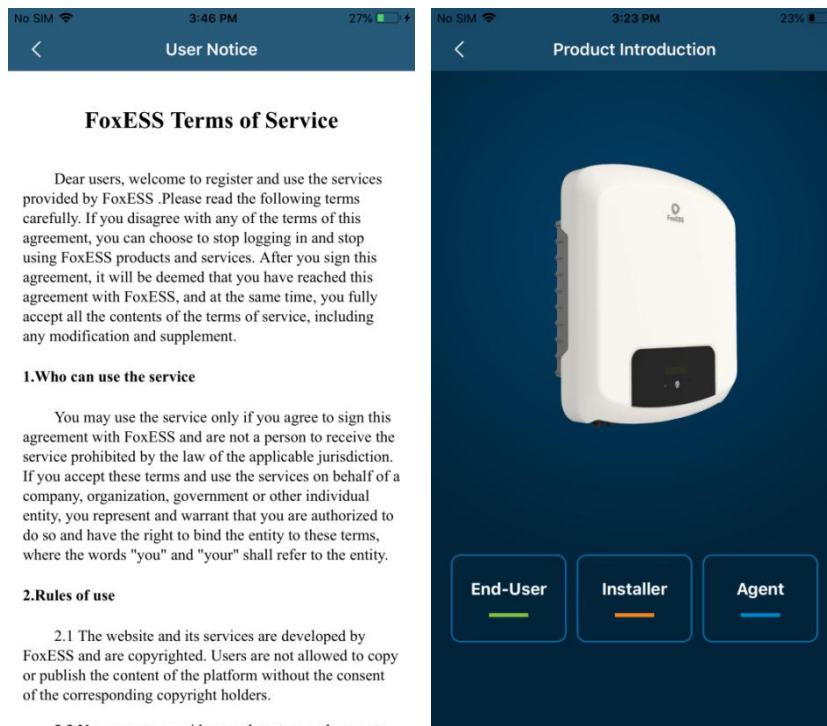

Figure1-1 Join as an agent

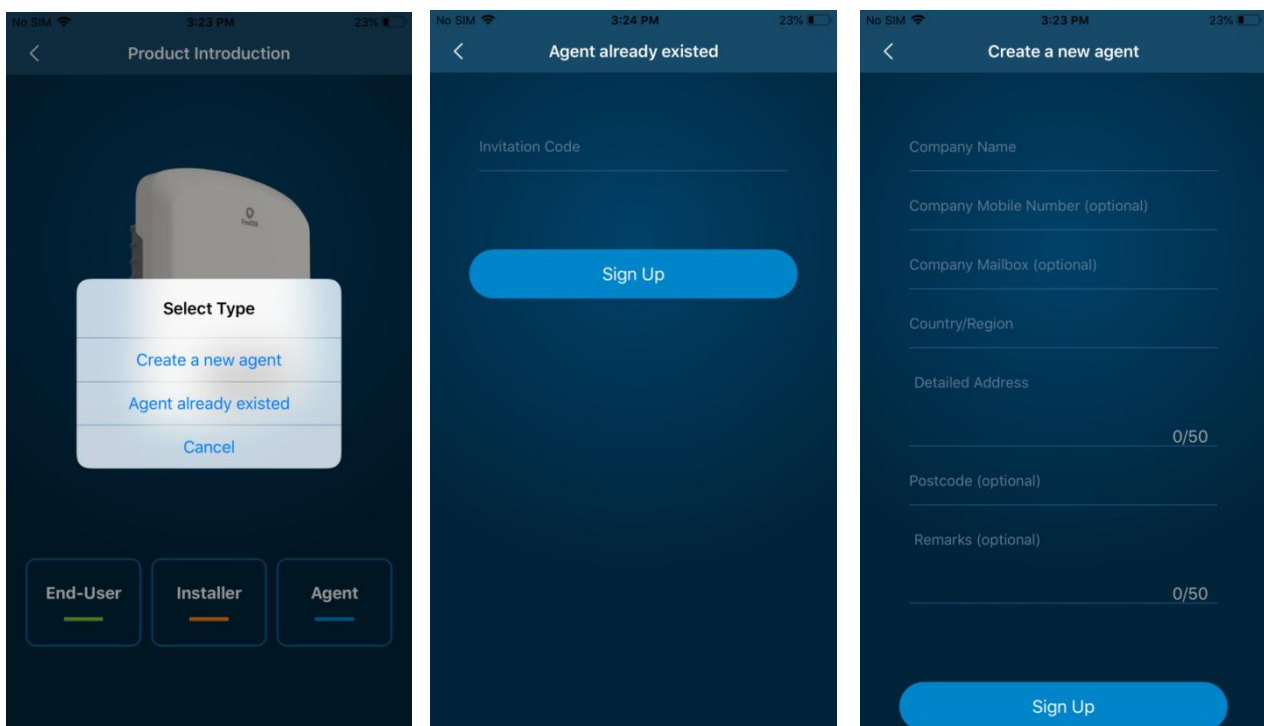




- Create an agent

Figure1-2 Create an agent



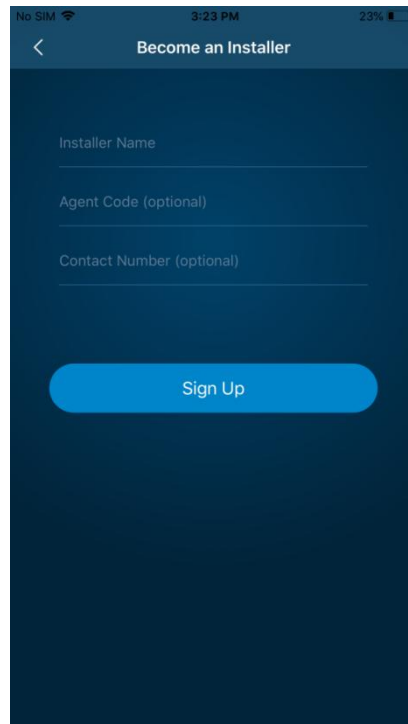
- **Installer**

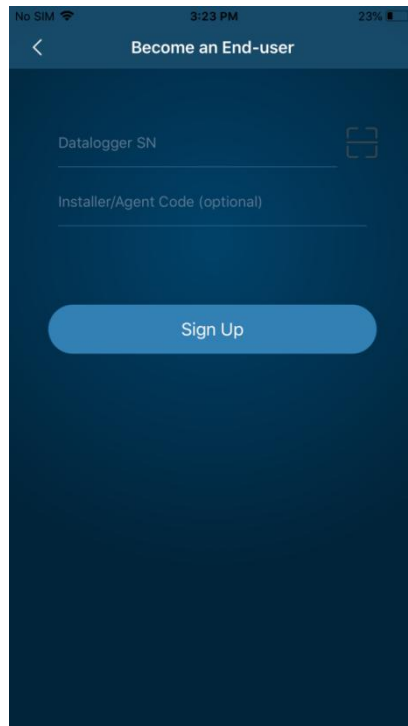
- End user

3.2 Login

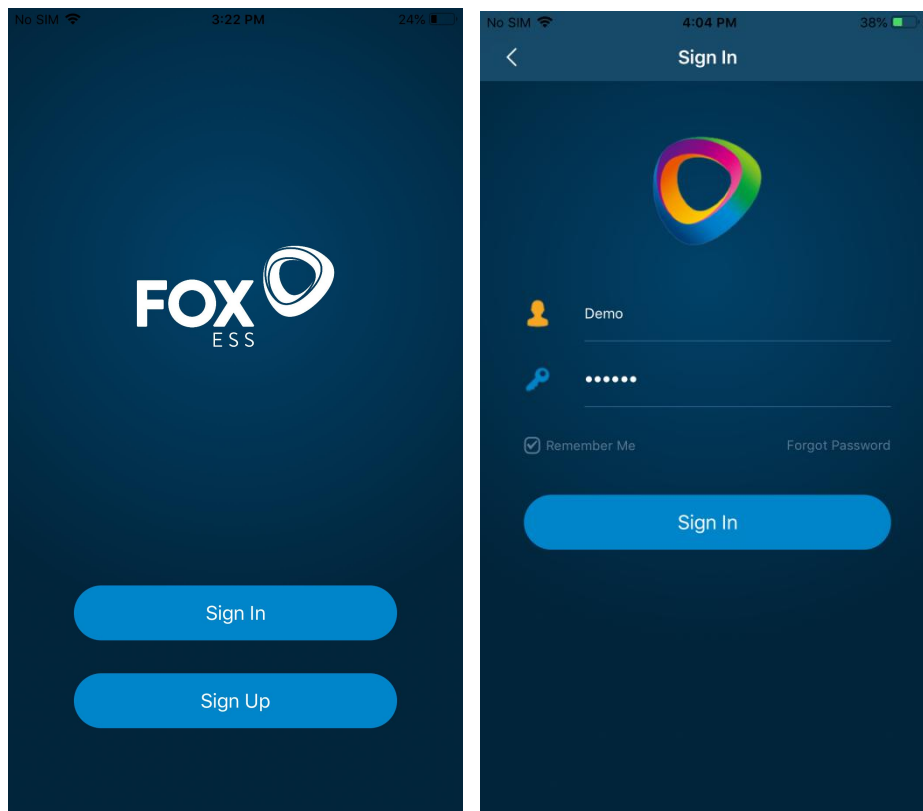
Operation steps

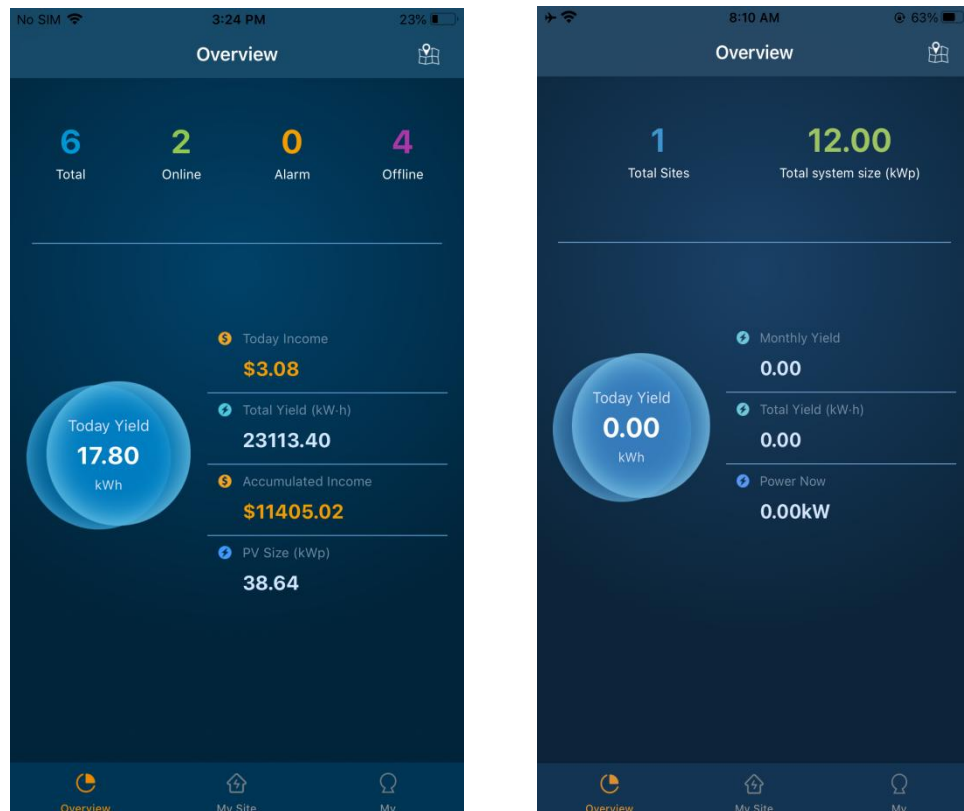
Figure2-1 Login

Displays an overview of online power plant information, including the number and status of plants, power generation statistics and power generation revenue statistics.

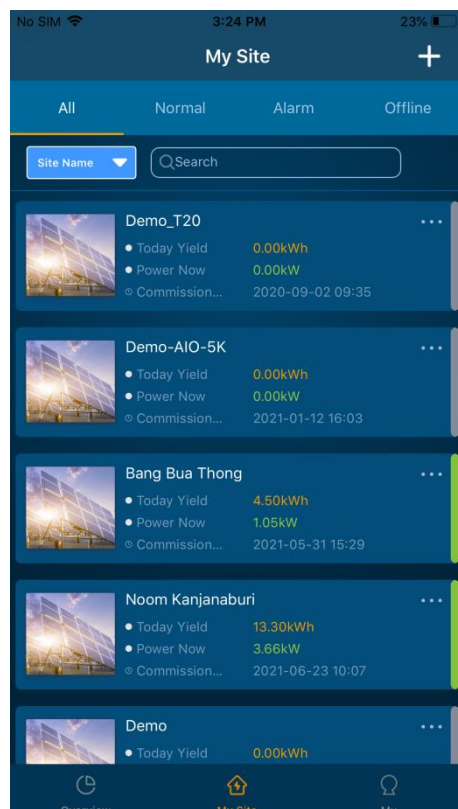
Figure3-1 Overview



3.4 My Site

- View information on all power stations under the current user
 - a. Agent: contains the power stations created by the Agent, the Installer is associated with the power stations created by the organization, the End User is associated with the power stations created by the organization.
 - b. Installer: contains the power station created by the Installer and the power station created by the End User associated with the Installer.
 - c. End User: the power station created by End User and the power station associated with End User.
- You can search and query by power station name, inverter SN, datalogger SN, and also view the power station by status.

3.5 Create a Power Station

3.5.1 Create Agent and Installer

Operation steps

Step 1 Click on the  in the top right hand corner of "My Site" to enter the build page and fill in the basic information about the power station.

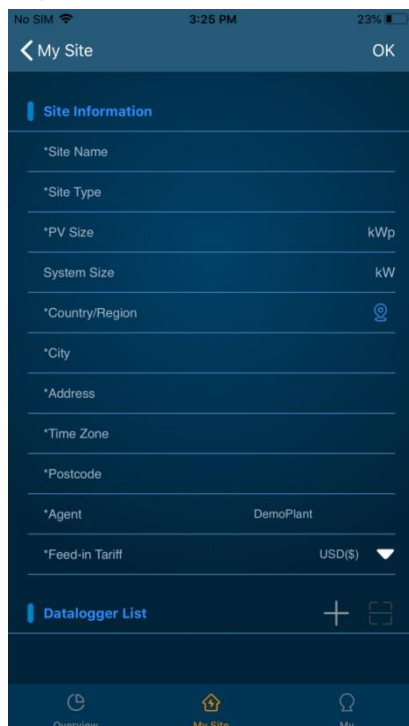
Step 2 Select the type of power station

- If all inverters in the power station are PV grid-connected inverters then select PV and set up a PV plant.
- If all inverters in the power station are energy storage inverters then choose energy storage and establish an energy storage power station.

Step 3 Enter the plant address and time zone and select the tariff to facilitate the calculation of plant revenue.

Step 4 Click on the Add/Sweep icon in the collector list, add the serial number of the communication module, bind that communication module to the power station and click on Confirm to finish building the station.

3.5.2 End User Creation/Association of Power Stations

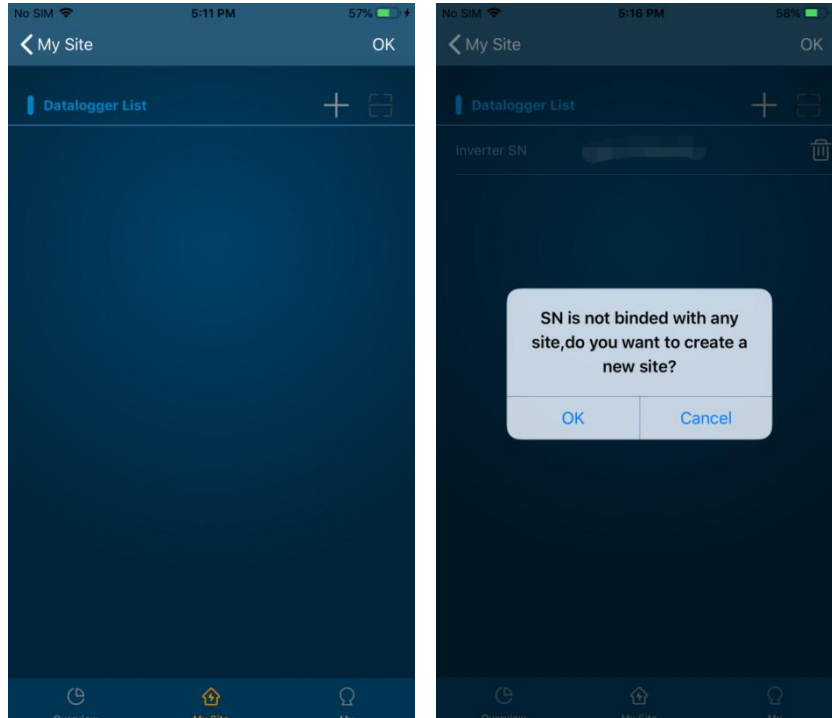
Operation step

Step 1 Click on the  in the top right hand corner of "My Site" to enter the association screen.

Step 2 Click on the Add/Sweep icon in the collector list, add the serial number of the communication module and click "OK".

- If the agent or installer has created a power station, the station is successfully associated.
- If no power station has been created, click on "OK" in the prompt box to jump to the Create Power Station page in Figure 5-1, where the end user creates the station themselves.

Operation step

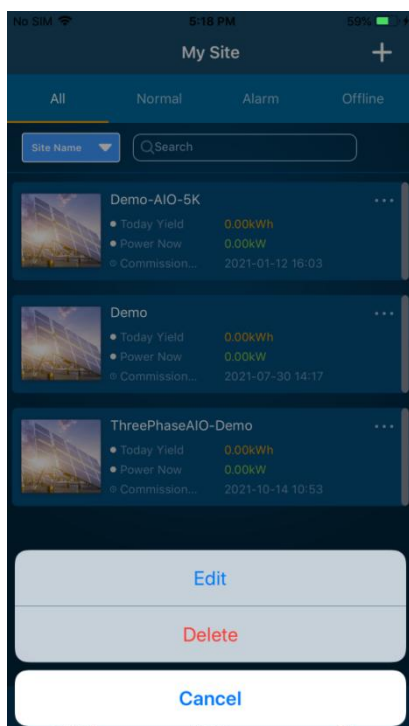
Step 1 In "My Site", click on the icon  to the right of the power station and a pop-up window will appear.

Step 2 Select Edit in the pop-up window to make changes to the power station information once you are on the power station edit page.

Step 3 Click on the Add/Sweep icon in the collector list to add a collector to a power station.

Step 4 Click on the delete icon in the list of collectors to delete the collector tied to the power station.

3.7 Power Station Details

Operation step

Step 1 Click on the name of the power station in "My Site" to go to the details of that power station.

3.7.1 Site Overview

Shows the current power of the plant, today's / cumulative power generation, and today's / cumulative revenue.

- Power: Shows the power of the power station for the current day and allows you to filter the date to see the historical power curve.
- Monthly/Yearly Yield: Shows a histogram of the current month/year's generation.

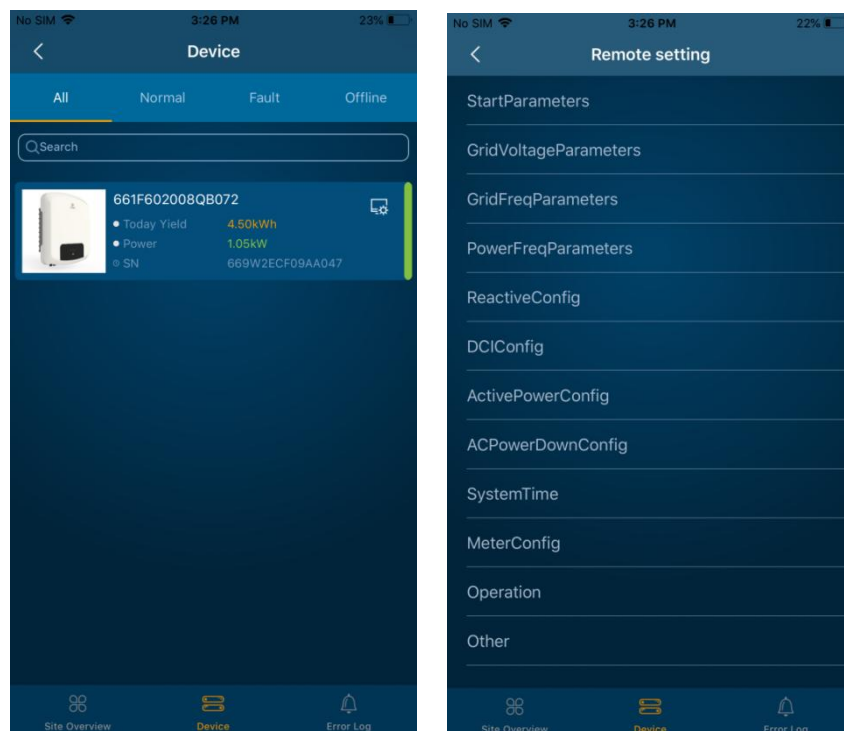


3.7.2 Device

Showing all the inverters currently in the power station.

- Target inverters can be searched by inverter status.
- Non-terminal users can set up the inverter remotely by clicking on the "  " in the top right corner.

Displays error messages for all equipment in the current power station for the day.

- The error reporting for this inverter can be obtained individually by searching for the inverter SN.

3.8.1 Equipment Details Page

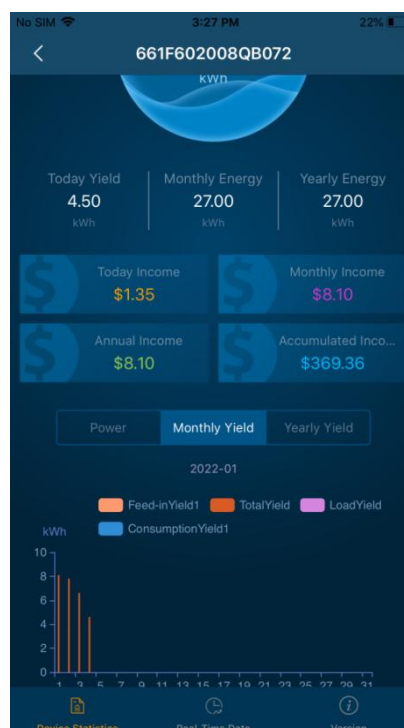
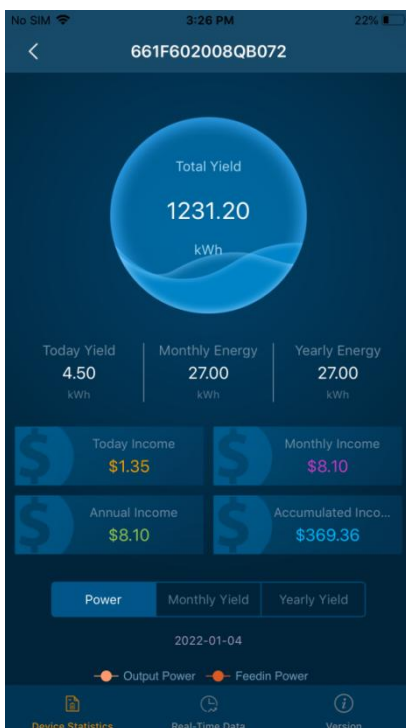
Includes Device Statistics, Real-Time Data, Version and Battery specific to the energy storage machine.

3.8.1.1 Device Statistics

Display of inverter cumulative and daily/monthly/annual power generation and revenue.

- **Power:** Shows the inverter power for the current day, with the possibility of filtering the date to view the historical power curve.
- **Monthly/Yearly Yield:** Shows a histogram of electricity generation for the month/year.

3.8.1.2 Real-time Data

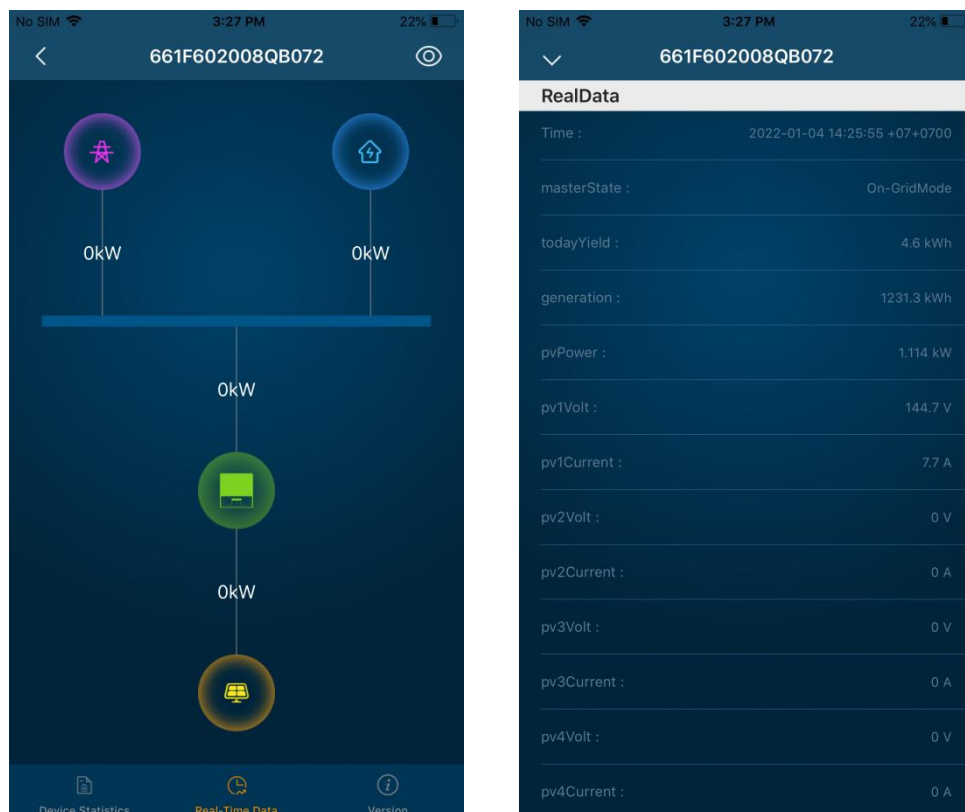
The current output power flow of the inverter is shown in the form of a flow diagram.

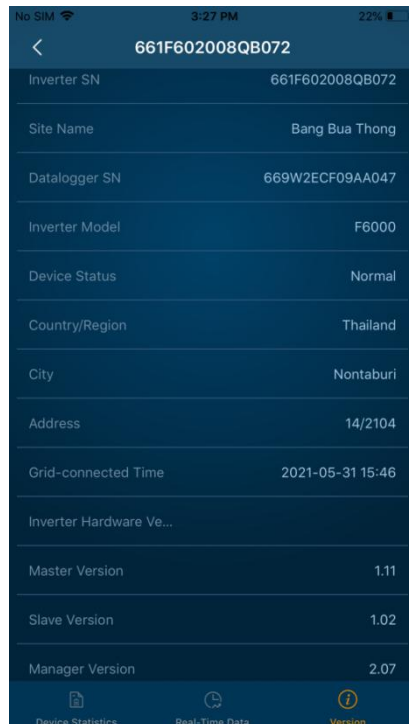

3.8.1.4 Battery

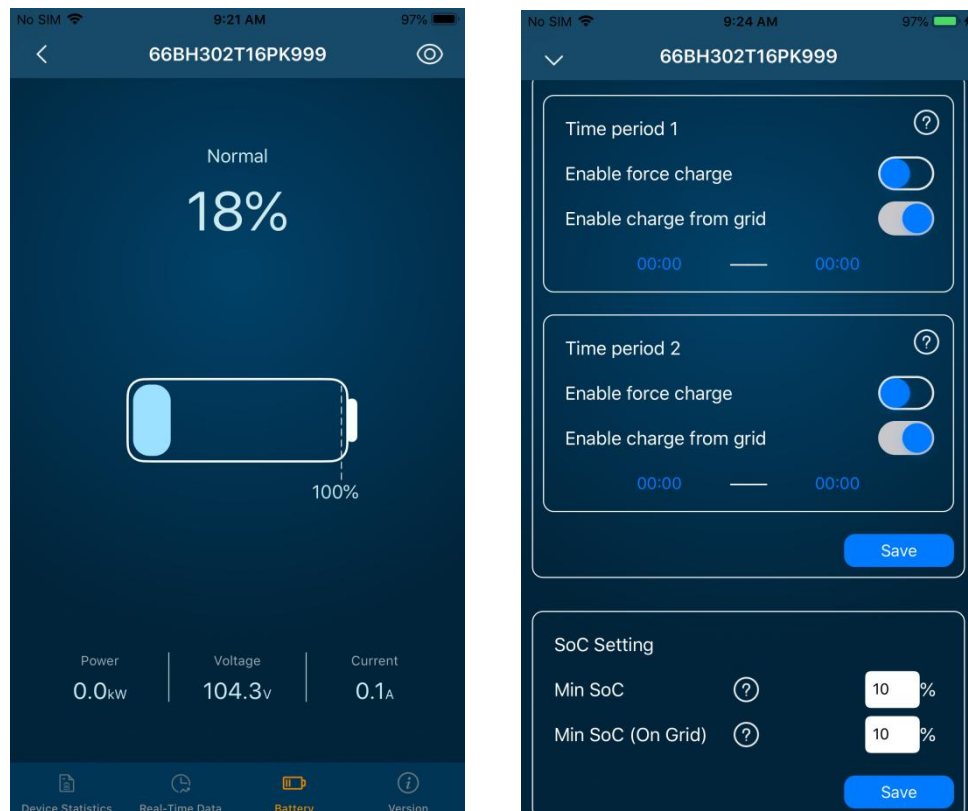
Shows the current operating status, charge, voltage, power and current of the batteries in the inverter.

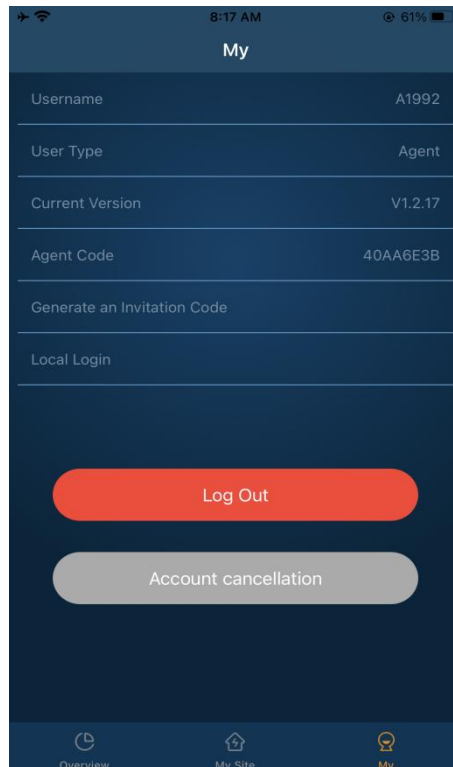


Figure 9-2 The Installer

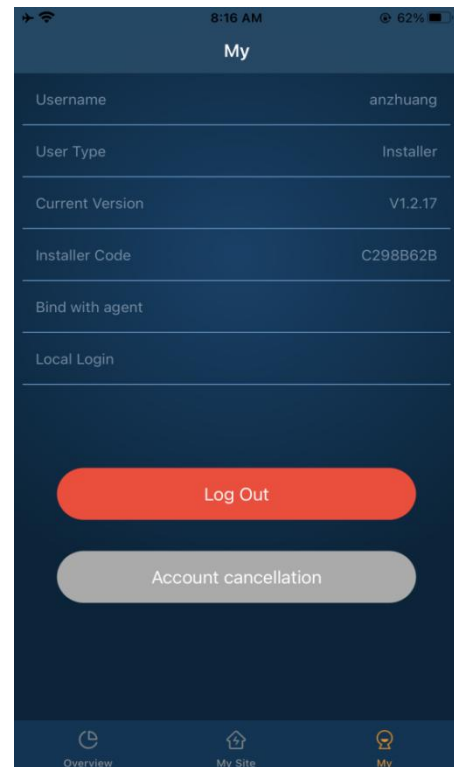
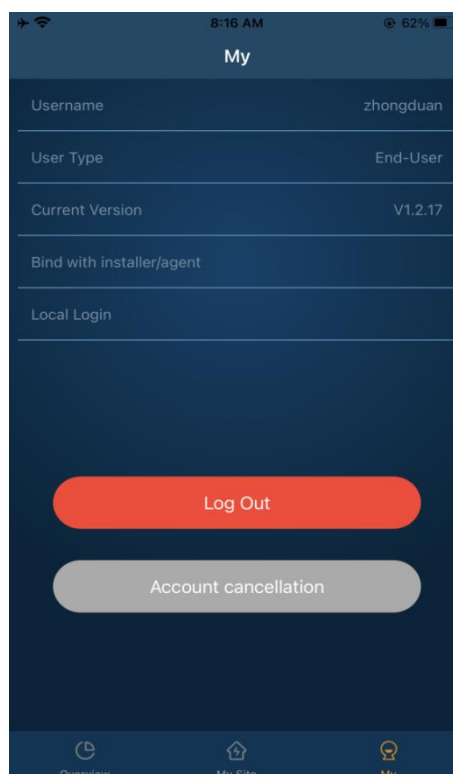


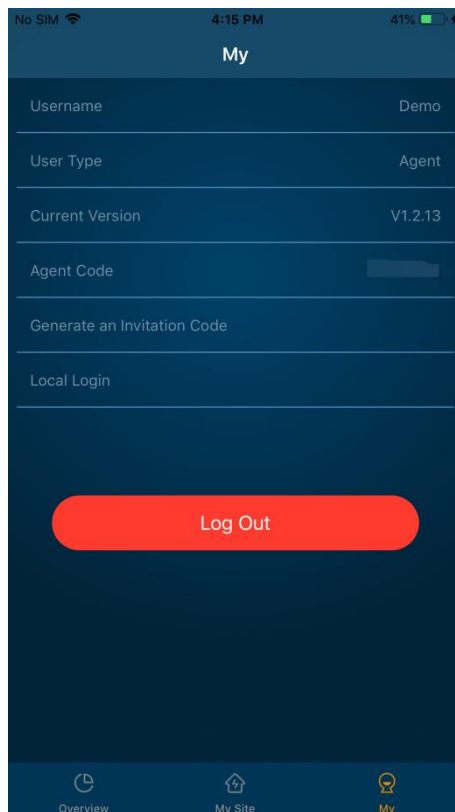
Figure 9-3 End-User



Operation step

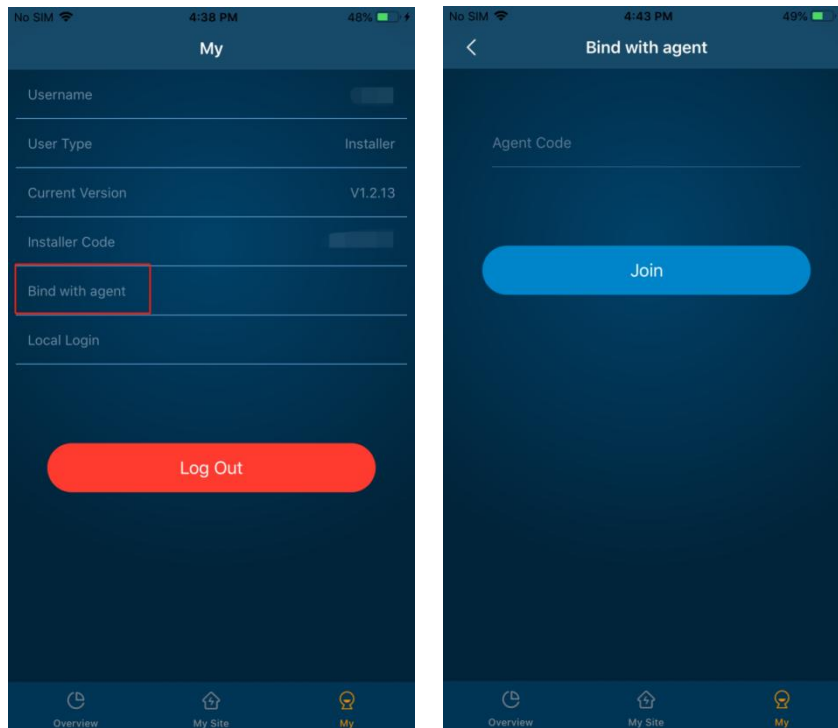
Step 1 The Distributor has the ability to generate an Invitation Code for new users to register to join the Distributor. Click on "Generate an Invitation Code" to generate it.

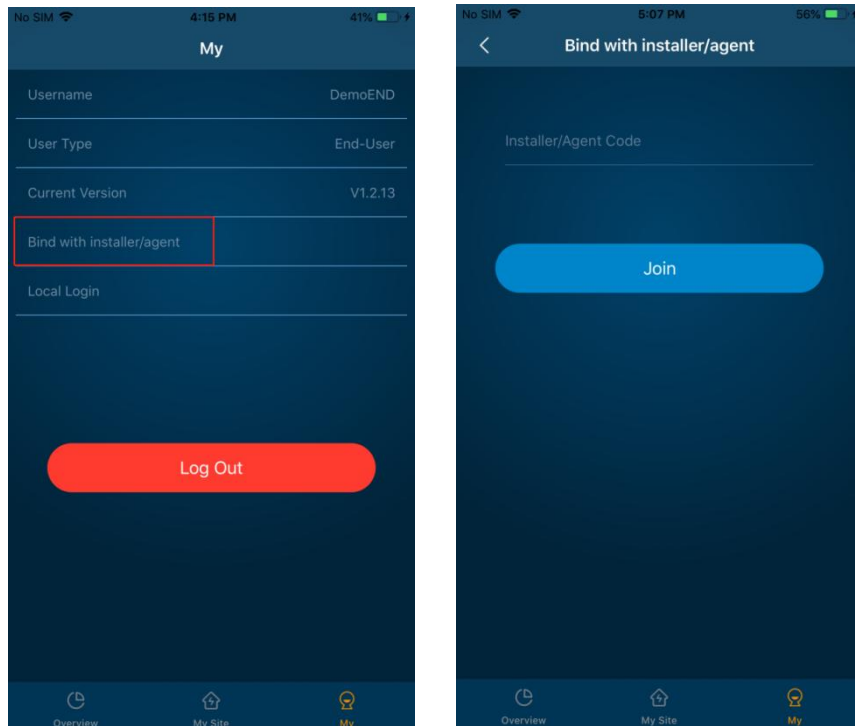

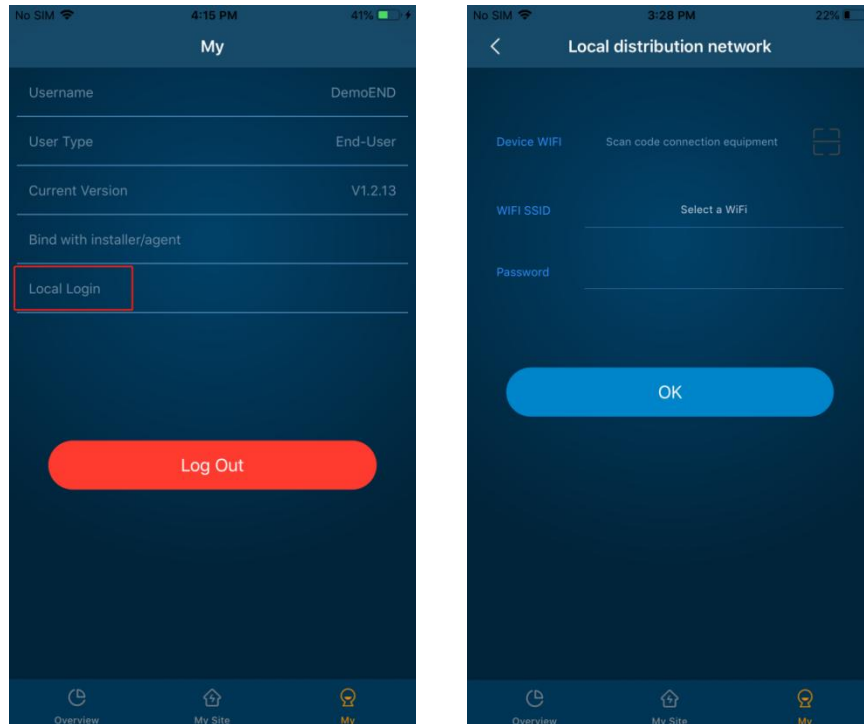

Operation step

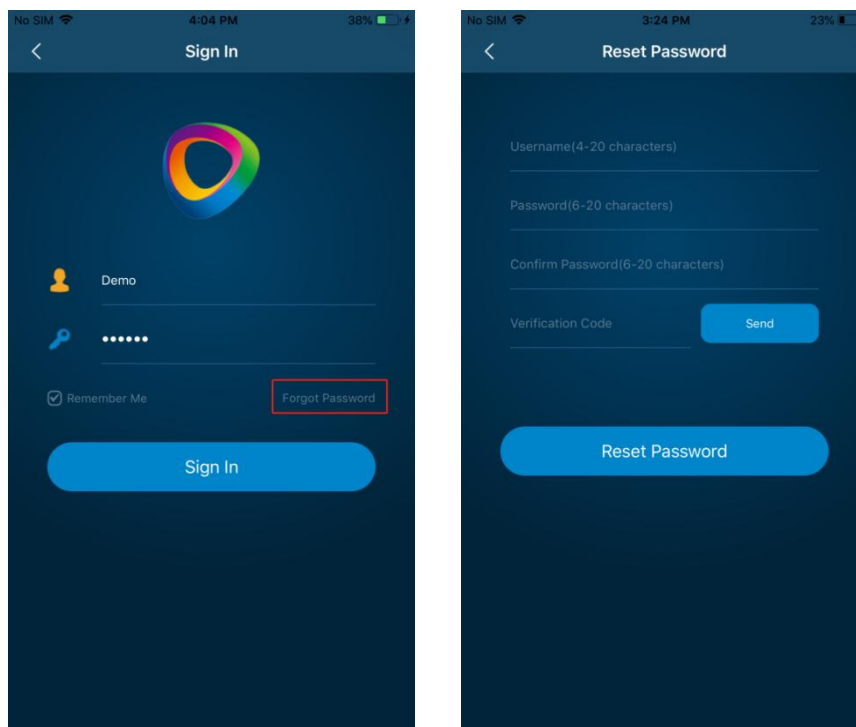
Step 1 On the login page there is a function to forget your password, click on "Forgot Password".

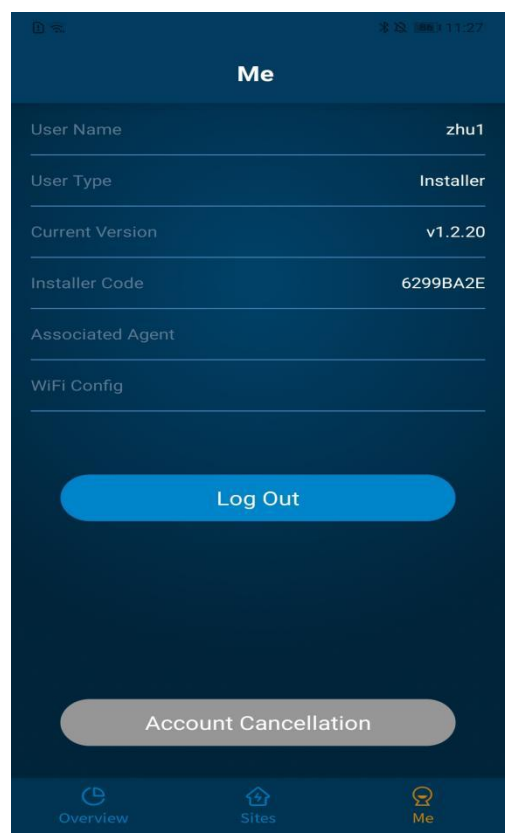

3.11 Account cancellation

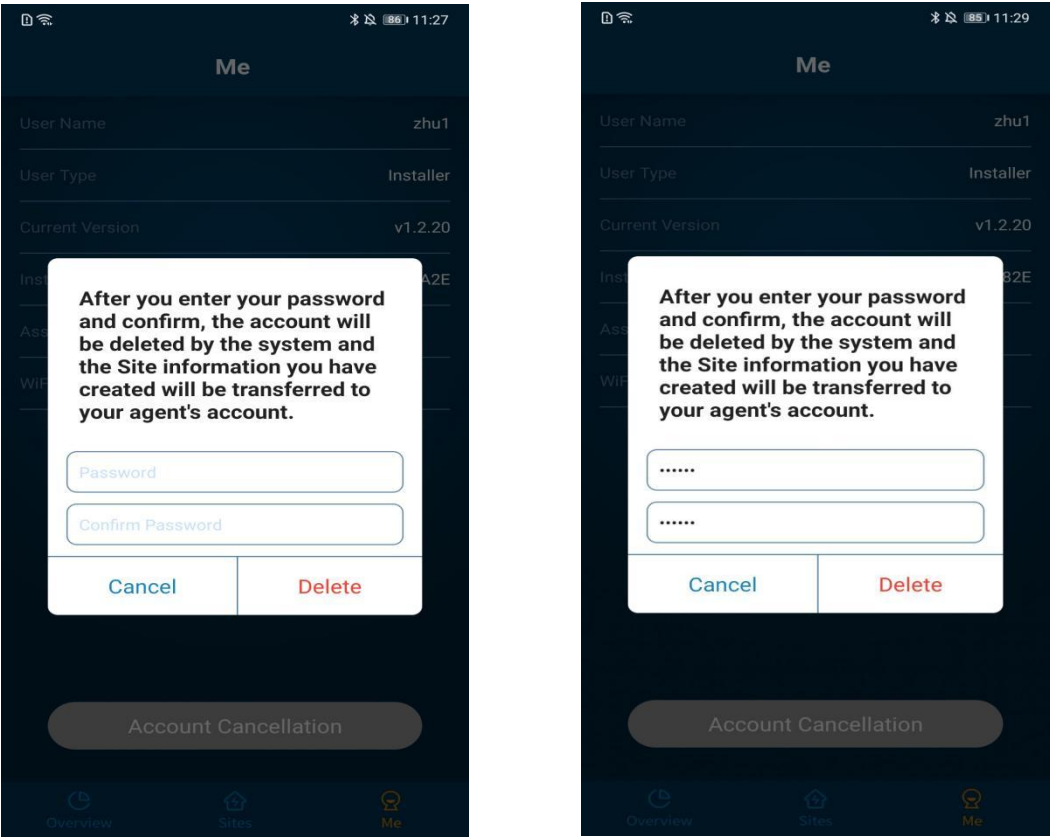
Step 1 Select My in the navigation bar below to enter the Personal Center page.
